

Severe Weather Information

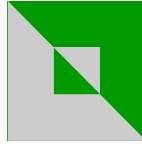
The Outdoor Warning System Sirens are tested at noon on the first Monday of each month, except for major holidays. The same siren system



may also be used for dangerous weather or civil defense emergencies. The decision to activate the siren system rests with local authorities. A **steady siren** tone will be used for a Comanche Peak plant accident or dangerous weather. A **slow wavering tone** is for a civil defense emergency. Please tune in to the Emergency Alert System(Radio Station **WBAP 820 AM or KJFZ, 870AM**, en espanol) for further information on how to proceed and what warning to prepare for.

If a warning is issued or if threatening weather approaches:

- In homes or small buildings, go to the basement (if available) or to an interior room on the lowest floor, such as a closet or bathroom. Wrap yourself in overcoats or blankets to protect yourself from flying debris.
- In schools, hospitals, factories or shopping centers, go to interior rooms and halls in the lowest floor. Stay away from glass enclosed places or areas with wide-span roofs such as auditoriums and warehouses. Crouch down and cover your head.
- In cars or mobile homes, abandon them immediately! Most deaths occur in cars and mobile homes. If you are in either of those locations, leave them and go to a substantial structure or designated tornado shelter.
- After the Tornado passes, watch for fallen power lines and stay out of the damaged area. Listen to the radio for information and instructions. Use a flashlight to inspect your home for damage. Do not use candles at anytime.

PECAN PLANTATION EMERGENCY SERVICES

Pecan Plantation Fire Department and EMS is a professionally trained staff of volunteer Emergency Medical Technicians, directed by an EMS Chief, EMS Administrator, Fire Chief, and Assistant Fire Chief. PPVFD & EMS EMT's range from first responders, basic, intermediate and paramedic levels. All EMT's are qualified by State and National Standards to provide the latest emergency care for the sick and injured. They are your fellow members, neighbors, and friends. Their training allows them to provide early emergency care, medical interventions, and fire-fighting needs under the well established protocols.



PPEMS has state of the art equipment that includes two completely equipped MICU ambulances, capable of transporting patients to Somervell, Hood, and other Metroplex medical facilities. Careflite is on call as needed and is capable of landing at the helipad located at the Pecan Plantation Airport.

What to do when having a fire or medical emergency:

- **Dial 911** for any fire or medical emergency.
- Try to remain calm and speak clearly and answer all questions asked, so correct information is relayed to the emergency personnel.
- If you see an emergency vehicle behind you or coming towards you, please pull to the right and allow the vehicle to pass.

Your safety is very important to local officials and the operators of the Comanche Peak nuclear power plant. Although it is unlikely a plant problem would affect you and your family, you need to be familiar with the information in this brochure. Additional information is available at

Notification: If there is a serious problem at Comanche Peak nuclear power plant which is likely to affect the public, the Outdoor Warning System Siren may be used to alert people within 10 miles of the plant. The decision to activate the siren system rests with local authorities. A steady siren tone will be heard for Comanche Peak or for dangerous weather. You may also receive a route alert (official vehicles driving through your neighborhood making an emergency announcement).

If you hear/receive a warning, tune your radio to **WBAP, 820 AM (or KFJZ, 870 AM en español)**, the Emergency Alert System radio station. Instructions from local officials will be issued on the radio and may include directions for evacuating your location or for remaining indoors (called sheltering) to reduce any possible exposure to radiation.

Instructions will be issued by zone. **Pecan Plantation is in zone 1c.** If evacuation or sheltering are recommended for zone 1c, please follow the instructions.

For Sheltering:

- Remain indoors.
- Close all outside doors and windows.
- Shift air conditioner to inside air or max or turn them off.
- Listen to WBAP for further instructions.

For Evacuation:

- Stay calm. You have plenty of time to leave. Drive safely.
- Take only what you need most, including: clothes, medicine, prescriptions, checkbook, credit cards, portable radio, flashlight and important papers.
- **Evacuate Pecan Plantation using the front gate and turn left on Highway 167. Go to the reception center at the Cleburne Civic Center, 1501 W. Henderson St. Use Highway 4 south to Cleburne or go to Highway 377, proceed East to Cresson and take Highway 171 to Cleburne.**
- Keep your car's vents and windows closed. If you use air conditioning, set it on inside or maximum so it does not pull in outside air.
- Once at the reception center, follow the officials' instructions. Be sure to register as this helps your family locate you.

When the emergency ends, instructions on returning will be announced over the radio station, **WBAP, 820 AM (or KFJZ, 870 AM en español)**.

If you have children in school, rest assured that there is an evacuation procedure for the school. Children may be relocated to the host schools in Cleburne or possibly in Stephenville. Do not try to pick them up from school if an evacuation has been recommended. They will already be en route to the host school. Information will be available on the radio or at the reception center.
